The world is more dangerous than at any time since the Second World War. The major war in Ukraine has already seen very large numbers of casualties, a vast increase in arms being deployed and the threat of conflict between nuclear powers using the deadliest weapons of mass destruction.

The demand for peace talks is overwhelming, and for an alternative

to endless war. In the Pacific arena there is also a growing threat of conflict, as weapons are poured into the region. We opposed the Russian invasion of Ukraine, but we also oppose the proxy war waged by NATO, which has engaged in major expansion since the end of the Cold War and is urging ever more arms spending by its member states.

It is the latest in a series of conflicts which have marked the 21st century from the failed wars in Afghanistan and Iraq to the bombing of Yemen.

The Stop the War Coalition has opposed all these wars. We argued against our government's involvement in the 'war on terror' which has ended in failure – with instability and misery in the countries involved. War and military spending are now a central feature of the major economies, to the detriment of their own populations, as well as those against whom the weapons are used.

Days after the humiliating withdrawal from Afghanistan, the US and Britain announced a military pact with Australia to ramp up the new cold war with China. The US already has 400 bases encircling the country.

The Tory government has pushed hard for a strong military involvement in the Asia Pacific region as part of its 'Global Britain' agenda, no matter the cost. They have unlimited funds for weapons of mass destruction yet can't afford to give public sector workers a decent pay rise.

The British government is one of the most belligerent in stoking up war. It is directly fueling tensions by supplying weapons and funds whilst promoting NATO intervention and expansion.

NATO is not a defensive alliance but one with expansion and aggression at its heart. The wars in Afghanistan and Libya were both NATO-led. Since 1999, it has added 14 new member states, all in Central and Eastern Europe, despite assurances at the end of the Cold War that it would not expand eastwards.

Joining the anti-war movement will help us campaign to oppose NATO's nuclear warmongering and interventionist agenda.
