## Venezuelan solidarity resolution

### This branch notes

1. The bombing of Venezuela and the abduction of President Maduro and his wife by the United States.
2. That this is the seventh country that the US has bombed in the last 12 months.
3. That the bombing and kidnapping of the head of state of Venezuela is a gross breach of international law.
4. The huge protests against the bombing and abduction by Venezuelans.

### This branch believes

5. That the attack on Venezuela is consistent within the new National Security Strategy which designates Latin and South America as a unique US zone of influence.
6. That the attack on Venezuela is consistent with previous statements by President Trump to the effect that the US requires control over Venezuelan oil and other natural and industrial assets.
7. That the attack on Venezuela is an aspect of the Trump administrations attempt to reconfigure the world order to the benefit of the US.
8. That European leaders are appeasing the Trump administration by refusing to take action in response to its clear breaches of international law and by slavishly following its demands that NATO countries increase arms spending.
9. That these policies threaten world peace, impoverish working people, and renew outdated and dangerous imperial structures of exploitation at home and abroad.

### This branch resolves

10. To demand an immediate end to attacks on Venezuela and the safe return of President Maduro and his wife.
11. To support all actions in solidarity with the people of Venezuela and to support the Venezuela Solidarity Campaign.
12. To demand that European leaders end the policy of appeasement towards the Trump administration and to declare its actions illegal and to initiate the appropriate international action to bring the US government to justice.
13. To call for the end of the drive to war in Europe, including the European rearmament programme and the polices of conscription that are sweeping Europe.
14. To affiliate to the Stop the War Coalition and support the international peace conference in London on 20 June 2026.
